## RECTOR'S THOUGHTS

What a glorious array of vegetables displayed at the Annual Willoughby Garden Club Show as usual this year. However I doubt that much of the produce grown will be stored with traditional methods for winter. No rush for sand to store carrots, Kilner jars for fruit, racks in an oast house to store apples. Much will be frozen, a small amount made into chutney and jam and very little wine from the abundance of the hedgerow.

Harvest has changed. Even on the farms, its big bales, sacks for silage and machinery. None of that "lazy" hay making with all hands to the fields with even the boys to get it in, or the smell of malaise at silage time.

Now we can have fresh fruit and vegetables from all over the world at any time of the year brought to us by big transporter planes, big wagons and displayed for us with all the technology and psychology to tempt us to buy.

Harvest Festivals have changed we now think about the poor in Africa or India. Think about Aids, leprosy, and a host of global issues like global debt.

We live in a global world forced by the media to think about problems and issues too big for us to comprehend let alone solve. Bombarded with ugly scenes of hate, murder and violence.

Then we are asked  
"Why is there no respect for people or property?"

The move towards globalisation has brought many advantages. For example I would not be a priest and travelled to as many counties that I have and I would probably still be living in Sussex. The movement of people means that the continuity of history is lost. How many people can remember or ever knew the farmers of Willoughby, Mumby, Cumberworth, Ulceby, Fordington, or Sloothby in the early post war period

Who have I missed from around Willoughby: Weston, Roughton, Snells, Johnsons, Melson, Mountains, Watsons, Reads, Spences, Hurdman

Within the parish we are mostly "incomers" and bring connections from other places with us, this changes the nature of community which also changes the bonding to the place.

The church buildings within the villages have the deepest roots in our communities but what happens inside has radically changed. How we talk about God has been influenced by global scholarship, our view of God's world affected by the movement of ideas.

Respect is built when there is ownership, commitment and involvement. All of which are impossible on the global stage but very simple locally. We can all live without God or our local community, but, if we deny our roots, our locality and the presence of God, we will be like badly stored pears, they rot from the inside and contaminate the whole store.

October is the time of Harvest Festivals. A time to remember that God has a hand in the works of man and women. Remember our friends on the global stage but also remember God and the locality. Take ownership, commitment, and get involved locally and "respect" will be a word used in relation to you and property.

### **>>>>>>>> ON TWO WHEELS**

**Silverstone 19-21st of August** saw Peter qualify in 11th position which put him on the 3rd row of the packed grid. He made a good start but had a few first lap moments with other riders and crossed the line 15th on lap 1. He soon made up ground and completed the race in a fine 10th position.

**Next round was Cadwell Park 27-29 August.** Peter took full advantage of being on home ground in front of a massive 40,000 bank holiday crowd. Having secured a second row start qualifying in 6th place, Peter finished up 4th over the line moving him up to 10th place in the championship

**Oulton Park 9-11th September.** Oulton, being the most technical and difficult circuit in the country saw Peter qualify 8th on the second row. Before racing commenced on Sunday a minutes silence was observed by all the racing community and the public for the tragic death of Chris Jones, the 14yrs old racer who sadly died at Cadwell. Peter had an average start and struggled to catch the leading pack but having jumped the gap made an error which dropped him back from 6th to 8th place which he held for the rest of the race. The next round is at Donington Park 23-25 September leaving Brands Hatch 7-10 October to finish the season. Regards Sue Dave Peter Hickman
