We keep mentioning Captain John Smith of Willoughby but who was he? Born here to George and Alice Smith and baptised on January 9th 1580. George was a Yeoman farmer of around 300 acres and tenant of Lord Willoughby de Eresby. John was educated at Alford, in the room above the porch on the church, and then at Louth. At 15 he was apprenticed to Sendall of Kings Lynn. His father died in April 1596. From here on the patronage of Lord Willoughby continued to assist him as he was placed under Joseph Duxbury, a captain under Sir Francis Vere, for three years in the low counties.

RECTOR'S THOUGHTS

Last month I mentioned that part of a priest's life is taking funerals. It's not the only thing we do - though sometimes it feels like it - we do officiate at weddings, baptisms, services of all kinds and of course the Eucharist (sometimes called - Holy Communion, Mass, the Lord's Supper).

There is a lot of confusion about the different roles and names within the church. A deacon is the 1st rung of ordination and does everything that a priest does but does not pronounce the blessing or absolution, or preside at the Eucharist. From deacon is ordination to priest. The next ordination is that of bishop. Bishops are called to continue to be priests but also to have oversight of the church, to confirm and ordain. Ordination is not the same as the roles or jobs done in the church. Deacon, priest and bishop are like qualifications not the jobs that are done

The most common asked question is what's the difference between a rector and a vicar. Today none. Traditionally a rector received the tithes and a vicar did not receive the tithes (tithes were a tax which provided the income for church or rectors). All such income since the sixties has been handled by the Church Commissioners. Since that time clergy income has been distributed evenly. Around the turn of the 20th century Willoughby as a living was

worth around £1,000 a year while Mumby was around £197 and there were livings in Birmingham at £50 a year. As there was no pension a priest stayed until they died especially in a good living such as Willoughby. Today priests and bishops can retire at 65 but may work on till 70 but must then retire. Pensions are what historical tithes are now used for along with some from the "quota". Quota is the offering by the church to the diocese to pay for clergy and administrators. As this contribution has not kept pace with rising costs, stipendiary clergy numbers are decreasing.

Other roles a priest may fulfil may be rural dean, this is an incumbent who acts as a go between the bishop/diocese and the clergy of a deanery, they also look after vacant parishes. The role is in addition to their role in their own parish. Priests may become full or part time chaplains to industry, education, health or even to the Queen. Some become archdeacons who's main role is committee based and they tend to deal with issues relating to the fabric of churches and the support of church wardens.

I'll talk about bishops and the governance of the church another time.

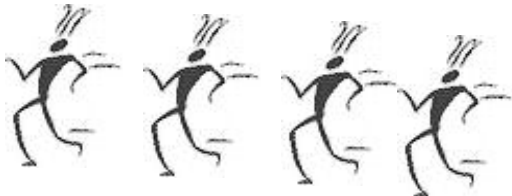

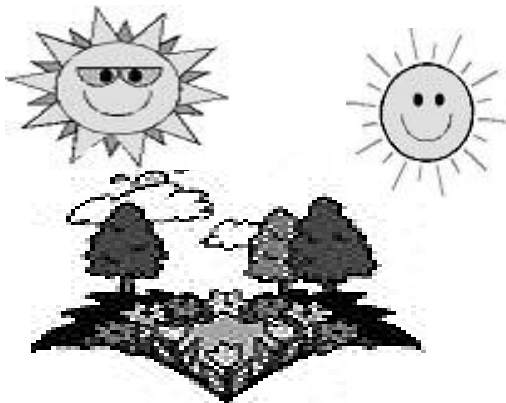
