After his capture and release from the Algonquins John returned to Jamestown with gifts. It was John Smith's trading that saved the lives of those few through the winter until Cpt. Newport returned with supplies and more men from England with 80 more colonists and fresh supplies in the spring.

In April Newport again left for England and John took responsibility for stores-raising his famous ditate "He that does not work, does not eat"

The gentlemen resented Smith's orders and became idle and crops failed.

The council saw in Smith a leader in whom the colony might survive, so on 10th September 1608 he became president.

By the end of his Presidency in September 1609 the colony was in good shape. Two weeks later a spark ignited his power pouch and burnt him between thigh and groin and he had to return to England.

## RECTOR'S THOUGHTS

We hear reports about how bad the National Health Service has become. From my own experience a few years ago and Mary my wife's recently, all I can say is we could not have asked for better treatment.

It is so easy to find fault, to express the negative, to argue from the particular to the general.

We expect our courts to listen to the evidence, weigh it up, and a jury to come to a decision based on the evidence not on emotions or prejudices. Why then do we state one of two things when it comes to religion? Either 1) call it a load of old superstition - i.e.; pre our growing up don't need it now or 2) live our lives on science and separate our religion believing tales about the bible which has not been studied and expecting and wanting the church to be what it was in the 18th century so that it can be seen as irrelevant.

But not the 21st century one.*

There are fundamentalists who believe that every word in the bible is true, placed there by God and if you read your bible and give your

heart to Jesus then you will live your life with no problems.

The bible is not written by God it is written by men over about a 3,000 years period who are trying to make sense of the world they are in and the God they experienced. It therefore has cultural influences, inconsistencies, and is fallible. Having said that it is still the only sane record we have of Jesus, his culture and his life. The more we study the cultural influences and inconsistencies the more God appears, for the writers are not trying to show Jesus' day to day diary but why his life, death and resurrection were going to change the world.

The God that appears from a study of the bible rooted in our own culture and science is so relevant to our scientific age. This God may seem totally different to the God of the 18th century but there is a continuity and as our world develops so will our knowledge of God.

Remember God does not ask much of us, He loves without conditions and asks us to do the same among one another. It is only in doing this that we can truly see the beauty around us and accept the smile from a nurse and know all will be well.

### Brands Hatch 29th Sept - 1st Oct

Mixed weather conditions for qualifying saw us once again with the wrong tyre choice and Peter ending up 20th and 5th row on the grid. Race 1: Race day saw heavy rain and the red flag preventing Peter from progressing further than 20th. At the restart he began to make up ground and steadily moved up to finish in 16th as the red flag again halted proceedings. Race 2: the final round of the season saw Peter determined to secure valuable double points. Again heavy rain hampered proceedings but Peter got a flying start and was 16th at the 1st corner, he was lying in 11th place when the red flag brought the race to an end. Peter ended the Bennetts British Superbike Championship in 18th place and said "Can't wait for next year to do it all again".

Well done - a brilliant first season in Superbikes.

### Darley Moor, Ashbourne, Derbyshire 7th - 8th Oct

Stars of Darley - a regular annual meeting where top invited riders compete for prize money. The weekend saw dry breezy conditions bringing in record crowds at this club venue.

The sprinkling of top riders could not stop Peter qualifying in pole position.

Race 1: A slow start saw Peter 5th into the first corner and made hard work to finish in 3rd place, but in charging from 5th to a close 3rd Peter showed his true potential, by claiming the **first 100mph lap and a new absolute lap record**.

Race 2: First out of the blocks to lead the race from start to finish. Once again lapping three consecutive 100mph laps, giving him a healthy 2.9 second lead by the finish. Collective points leaving Peter 2nd overall for the Stars of Darley Races. An excellent performance in front of the Darley record crowd.

### Mallory Race of the Year

Thankfully the silly chicane at Gerards was abolished for the 'Race of the Year'. Peter qualified 5th on the grid next to Ian Hutchison in 6th riding the second Hawk Kawasaki. Chris Walker from World Superbike rode the Rizla Suzuki on pole. With a 20 lap race, Walker cleared off to win, leaving Peter fighting for 4th position with John McGuinness. After 4 laps of trying Peter finally passed him and charged ahead to catch up the front runners. Back markers played their part with Peter finishing in 4th place. Team mate Ian finished 6th.

**This brings the racing to a close for the year.** Peter has had a brilliant first season on Superbike and we are very proud of him. An announcement will be made at the N.E.C. 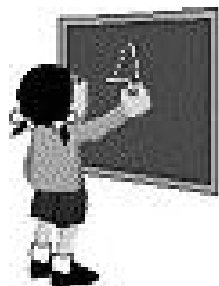
