## RECTOR'S THOUGHTS

Unless you are a follower of Church politics you will probably not know that in America there has been a massive argument raging over the fact that the Episcopal (Anglican) church has appointed a female bishop to lead them, i.e.; their archbishop. This has led to some traditionalist church communities breaking away looking for Episcopal oversight to a Nigerian bishop. The traditionalist find it impossible to accept a female can be a priest let alone a bishop and to be the head of all the bishops was too much.

Bp David C Jones, suffragan bishop of Virginia said (Church times 2nd February 2007).

"I reject with all my might the notion that our theology has changed. It is outrageous to suggest that we have abandoned our faith." He accused the secessionists of moving away from the notion of belonging to the church through baptism in Christ "to an emphasis on adherence to one particular point of view - that development is not Anglican."

What are the principles of being an Anglican, i.e.; in this country being Church of England? Firstly being baptised in Christ. This is not strictly Anglican as baptism makes a person a Christian of any denomination. Being confirmed (making a adult decision to accept the baptism made probably on your behalf) in the Anglican tradition means commitment to the tradition.

As I've stated in an earlier Rector's Thoughts there are many traditions within Anglicanism.

Anglicanism has always been a "broad church" with freedoms of style and thinking, although we disagree profoundly over many things, the debate has enabled the church to grow and adapt.

It is very sad for everyone when schism happens. Friends become rivals and a wound is created. Debates rage over who owns what, lawyers become involved, communities harden attitudes. The same problems appear as in a divorce between a couple only on a community wide basis, the trauma and hurt affects everyone.

We say as Christians that we belong to God and to each other. People who seldom go to church to worship the God they profess would argue that they belong. The Church of England is not a membership church, it is the church of the people. The priest has oversight of all who live in the parish regardless of colour, creed or any other distinction. Therefore in splitting away from the oversight of the diocesan bishop because in this case women bishops the churches in Virginia (and elsewhere) are stating God loves some and not others. This makes them an exclusive church as opposed to an inclusive church which Anglicanism is meant to be.

## CHECK WHO'S TAKING YOUR RUBBISH

Householders could face fines of up to £5,000 if they fail to check who is taking their rubbish away. New waste regulations have been introduced to slash the thousands of tonnes of rubbish that are fly-tipped each year. People who need to have household, garden or construction waste from their home must check the waste carrier registration of anyone they employ, or offers to remove the waste for them.

Householders should ask to see the carrier's registration and make a note of the number. If there is no certificate, the service should be refused. If it is accepted and the operator fly-tips the rubbish, the householder will face a fine of up to £5,000 – and may also be charged for the clearance!

## SLOOTHBY NEWS

**News of the month – Sloothby is actually going to get Broadband!!** This will be provided by the company 'Zonebroadband' through a Satellite Base Station to be located at the house of Bob Eyre. The system will then be extended by wireless to be terminated at the homes of the user, currently those who attended the meeting with the Zonebroadband Manager at 'The Mount' on Friday 2nd of February. Ten or eleven of us have signed up for the system which, subject to a survey by the company, should be in and working in around 3 weeks from today 14<sup>th</sup> February. There is room for more!! (Signed-up does not cost you anything until your terminal is in and working).

It has been a long complicated business but we are on our way. **We believe the range can extend to around 3 + miles** from Bob's house so if you are on the outskirts of the village e.g. Hasthorpe and similar distances please call me on 01507 466651 and I will let you have a form to complete to join our now 'Merry Band of Communicators'!!

The costs are, a one off charge of £129 and then a monthly £25. A small 'Receiver box' goes on the side of your house and a cable is linked into the house to your PC. You can have up to 3 PCs in your home connected for the same price. Your PC if fairly new, will have an internal Ethernet Board to which the cable will be connected external to the PC or if your PC is on the elderly side you may need to buy one at around £10 but if you have a spare USB connection you can utilize this by purchasing a 'dongle' type device. I do not know how much this will be but it should not be expensive. The other associated good news is that when BT finally get their better capacity line to us, we will not have to change our supplier and the price will drop to around £17 a month.

We have some new villagers and I welcome them on behalf of those of us who are already 'dug-in'? If you are new to the "Viking" village and interested in Broadband let me know and I will sort things out for you.

If you are an additional dog owner, we look forward to your co-operation in 'picking-up' and using a Lead whilst in the village that we may enjoy a clean and safe environment. We now have great co-operation in these respects although I note that some have forgotten their Lead recently!

Well that is it, Spring is nearly upon us so I hope we have lots of sun to cheers us up.

I write this on Valentine's Day and to those of you who forgot the flowers for their lovely wife and suffered that special 'he'll associated with forgetfulness within the boundaries of married life, I offer you the following paraphrase:-
