RECTORS THOUGHTS

The Kingdom as Jesus saw it was inclusive. The Gospels are full of stories where Jesus includes the blind, the lame, the leper and all other outcasts of his day. He included women and foreigners. Our source book, the bible, also states that at creation "all people were made in the image of God". St John tells us that the incarnation was an act of solidarity with mankind "God so loved the world".

St. Paul understands this and shows us that God does not build fences or create rules. God does not distinguish for example between Jew or Greek, slave or free. Paul fought for the inclusion of Gentiles when the fledgling church was on the brink of schism. Then there is that lovely passage in 1 Corinthians 13 that everyone wants at their wedding about the nature of Love.

The Church of England is based on the parish by its statute in law which is an inclusive model, "the vicar has the care for all souls". This decree does not exclude anyone.

The tide of worldwide Anglicism at present is turning towards an exclusive Christianity, making rules for who can be in or out. The African churches rhetoric towards the American church is of a theology that wishes to exclude certain groups. This is totally opposite to the Gospels' notions of Jesus touching the outcaste, the dead, and any who needed his compassion. When the Jews condemn, Jesus heals and redeems. Where Jews brought sobriety, Jesus brought fun and laughter. The only ones to be excluded were those who excluded themselves.

The Anglican Church locally and nationally is struggling at present and in response is building a fortress mentality, but the real solution for the church is to re-engage with the original Gospel of Jesus and become a Kingdom people and remembering that God so loved the world gave his only begotten son so that all may have life and have it in abundance.

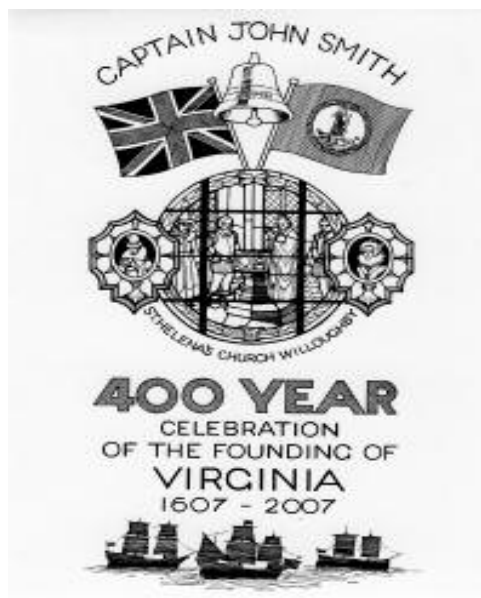

PARISH COUNCIL / HIGHWAYS MEETING

Members of the council met with Mr Butler from L.C.C. Highways Dept on 8th June to discuss village problems.

1: White Lines on the Main Road: Mr Butler is to arrange for these to be repainted.

2: School Safety Zone: Highways are reluctant to extend the markings as they feel the result will be parking on the opposite side of the road.

3: 30MPH Reactive Signs: These are at present on trial in various places. More signs may be placed in prioritised locations. Each sign costs approximately £5000, parishes wishing to have them can contribute to the costs.

4: Church Road: It may be possible to have this surfaced provided the road does belong to Highways - this to be checked.

5: Willoughby Signs: Highways to try to sort out the erection of these before the 30th June.

Dvorák String Quartet No. 12 in F, Op. 96, "American"

Towards the end of the 19th Century America became a big draw for many of Europe's most famous composers. Dvorák spent three years in New York as director of the National Conservatory of Music, and it was during this time that he wrote several of his most popular works, including the 'New World' Symphony and the 'American' Quartet. Gershwin longed to be taken seriously as a composer and the 'Lullaby', a charming, delicate piece, was one of his earliest attempts at writing music in a standard classical genre.
