RECTORS THOUGHTS

Here we are at the start of a new year and a time when I reflect on the past years and think about the future for the parishes. Each parish has seen changes to its building since 1990. These changes have come about when the whole community has been behind them.

In 1992 Mumby and Cumberworth had a village appraisal which among other things culminated in 2000 with opening of the Nave as a dual purpose space for the village and surrounding area. Since then we have added small improvements.

Willoughby has seen smaller changes over the same period. We started by improving the vestry into a usable small room with some money left by Albert & Beatty Dalton. Then came a new boiler, the banners and the north door hanging along with cushions for the pews. We still want to add a toilet and kitchen area.

Ulceby has not seen changes but regular maintenance including in the past year the roof to the porch but has had its community moments. It produced a fine snapshot book for the millennium and has changed its service to enable the young ones to feel welcome and part of the service.

Why the changes to the buildings? In part, to bring them back to their traditional use. A community building used for assorts of events not necessarily religious. Churches were always the largest community buildings as they are in our villages today.

Change is only possible when a community wants it to happen. Willoughby's 2007 celebrations showed the value of the presence of a building and a village wishing to celebrate. From celebrating John Smith's baptism to literature and the whole village with external support providing a community play worthy of a community anywhere.

What of the future. We have to remember that our buildings function as a multitude of things; a tourist attraction, theatres, community centres to name a few but their primary purpose is spirituality. Places of worship, the soul of the village. Can you imagine the oldest buildings in Willoughby or Mumby (Ulceby is 1834 but the site is older) no longer being there? Claxby, Cumberworth and Sloothby already know this feeling as do the Methodist throughout this group.

The buildings are important to the collective consciousness but their primary function seems to be lost, not just here but nationally. What do we have to do to bridge the gap to enable organised spirituality to be as important on a regular basis as Tesco's? The answer has got to be connected to the statement in the first paragraph "when the whole community has been behind them".

Church and secular are already connected as I'm sure you are aware. The Church of England is part of the law of the land and still a parochial system where everyone in the parish is in the care of the Rector and the PCC. Parishioners have the right to be baptised, married or buried (providing legal criteria are met. For example in the case of marriage at least one member has to have been baptised and lives in the parish). The Churches are therefore part of the community.

The churches however are struggling both for finance and "man power". Each church needs to raise its income. In the case of Mumby and Willoughby this needs to be at least another £1,000 per year. Like all institutions we are being hit with rising costs; insurance, heating, transport, etc., and thus need to improve income and the work of the church is falling on a smaller group of volunteers. If you are interested in our costs, in March will be our AGMs and accounts will be available then to see where our income is spent and raised from.

This double edged sword of reduction of people and finance is reducing the possibilities of the church being an care agency. We would like to increase our support from the communities. Will you support your local church as we, try to support you?
