## RECTORS THOUGHTS

I have become aware of how little is known or understood of the bible especially the Old Testament (OT) by people generally. It's so important to know even the basics of the OT to be able to begin to understand what the Gospel and Epistle writers in the New Testament (NT) were trying to interpret from their past in the light of Jesus' ministry. There is too much to put it all in one set of thoughts so I'll start this month and come back to it again in the future.

*The 3000 year road of the bible starts with the Fable stories:*

The Creation (Genesis (Gen) 1)  
Adam and Eve, Garden of Eden, the story of the apple and the fall from grace (Gen 2)

Noah building an ark, the flood, then the Rainbow (Gen 6-8)

The reason for the multitude of languages in the tale of the Tower of Babel (Gen 11)

*The real story starts with Abraham:*

Abraham leaves his family in Haran and moves south (Gen 17)

Abraham offers his son Isaac for Sacrifice at God's request. (Gen 22)

Isaac is not sacrificed and has two sons; Essu & Jacob. Jacob receives the family blessing from Isaac by trickery (Gen 27), he then heads for Haran to find a wife and escape the possible vengeance of his brother.

Jacob spends 21 years in Haran and that is a whole story in its own right. Jacob has 12 boys (we are not told how many girls). To his wife Leah: Reuben, Simeon, Levi, Judah, Issachar, Zebulun; to Leah's slave Zilpah: Gad and Asher. To his other wife Rachel: Joseph ("multi coloured dream coat") and Benjamin. With Rachel's slave Bilhah: Dan and Naphtali (Genesis 35:23-26)

Joseph's brothers sell him into slavery and for various reasons the family move to Egypt at Goshen. After several generations the descendants end up as slaves. We are not told how this came about.

Why are these facts important?  
Three examples among many.

1) For a start there are 12 sons which become the 12 tribes of Israel. Jesus has 12 disciples even if we can't make a coherent list from the names provided in the Gospels. "The 12" represents a symbolic notion of "12 tribes".

2) Knowing the story of Isaac's sacrifice helps in part to understanding some of the meaning in John's account of the crucifixion in his Gospel. As Isaac and Abraham walk up the hill, Isaac asks "I have the wood on my back you have the fire, where is the sacrifice?" Abraham replies "God will provide". Like Isaac, Jesus carries the wood on his back up the hill and God provides the sacrifice in Christ himself instead of the ram in the thicket.

3) Pauline theology Jesus is the new Adam. For him the fable stories were facts so there was a real Adam and Eve who disobeyed God and created the problem of original sin which all carried. As we were all flawed only God was pure enough to remove this fault from mankind. For Paul, Jesus is the Son of God crucified for our sins, the sacrifice worthy to take away original sin which we all carried because of Adam.

*The next stage is rise of Moses.*

Moses leads the people out of Slavery in Egypt for eighty years (most people think it is 40 years) around the dessert to create a nation which Joshua leads into the "land of milk and honey" i.e.; Israel.

More on that another time.

In the mean time why not sit and read Genesis again - in a modern version please.

A new year begins and the start of a new Race Season. Although plans for racing in Europe got off to a good start for Peter, with testing in Almeria in Spain in January and Cartagena in February, there it all ended. Q Motorsport for whom Peter was to ride in the Superstock European Championship, folded due to a lack of funds. Thus leaving Peter without a ride. Having reclaimed Peter's bike we are back to the starting blocks.

A one-off ride with Suzuki GB on a 750 GSXR, in Valencia on April 6th went very well. Peter qualified in 13th place and finished the race in 10th. He was pleased with the result as he had not been to that race track or ridden the bike before.

Thruxton April 18th -20th Riding with his new sponsors, Ultimate Racing and Sleaford Racing, Peter's first qualifying saw him finish in 7th place. Being wet in the second session he decided not to go out and risk things as no-one would improve on their lap times in those conditions. In the race starting from the 2nd row in the grid Peter went from 6th to 3rd in the first corner and continued to battle for the lower leader positions throughout the race. Finishing a close 5th. 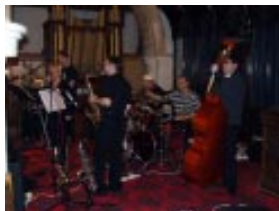

### **Cumberworth Parish Annual General Meeting**

The Parish Annual General Meeting took place on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> April in Beckets in Mumby. Thank you to the 18 villagers for coming out on a cold wet evening to give their support.

The Minutes of the meeting in November were read and agreed. Peter Odling and Christine Clark were re-elected joint Chairmen, Sally-Ann Dowley was re-elected Parish Clerk and Treasurer and Brian Holt was re-elected Internal Auditor.

A contract has been agreed for the up-keep of the Village Churchyard for one year with an option to renew. The plan for a bench on the green is to go ahead. Further enquiries are to be made with the Charities Commission to enable the winding-up of the obsolete Joseph Waithe Hart Charity. Further steps are to be taken reference the speeding of cars through our village. Both the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership and the L.C.C. Highways Committee have been contacted reference the problem and their comments are awaited. There was some discussion as to the condition of the lane, following the work done on the dykes. The Welcome Sheet for new residents is in hand and should be completed shortly.

After some discussion, it was decided not to hold either a Village Fete or Garden Party, because of the problems with Insurance and Health and Safety. However, it was decided to have two informal, social meetings a year in July and January in the Red Lion in Mumby. The dates and venue are to be confirmed. It is hoped that residents will support this venture.

The next Parish Meeting, to which all residents are invited, will be held on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> November 2008 at 07.00 p.m. in Beckets in Mumby.
