## RECTORS THOUGHTS

In the May edition I wrote about the beginnings of Israelite history - from creation to Abraham's family ending up in Egypt. In time Joseph (great grandson of Abraham) and what he did for the Egyptians were forgotten. We are told that the family grew in number and eventually became slaves. Yet their numbers continued to increase and the Pharaoh wishing to reduce their numbers ordered all male children to be killed, but Moses survived, was found and adopted by the Pharaoh's daughter. Moses grew up in the courts of Pharaoh and would from there have learnt much about the desert ways of the Bedouin.

As an adult Moses saw how his people were treated, he killed a slave master then ran away in fear. He married and settled down as a shepherd. God called him to lead his people out of Egypt. Moses is unsure he has the skills but God convinces him and is told to say by God to the Israelites that "I AM sent you". Then comes the ten plagues, the last of which is the destroying angel who kills all the first born males in Egypt. The Israelites are not affected because they have put blood on the lintels of their doors as commanded and eat their last meal in Egypt before leaving in the morning. Their flight to freedom almost comes unstuck when the Egyptian army follow them and trap them by the sea but God parts the Red Sea so the Israelites can cross on dry land.

They receive "The Law" by which they are to live and for forty years they are Bedouin in the desert learning to be a community. At this point God tells them to take the land that is to become Israel but they don't trust God sufficiently and don't take the land. God punishes them by sending them into the wilderness for another forty years.

After this Moses climbs a high mountain so that he can see the promised land and dies on the mountain and the leadership passes to Joshua who leads the people into the land starting with Jericho where the "walls came tumbling down". (Read Exodus and Joshua).

Why is this important?

The Israelites took freedom (the Exodus) - they develop a community (the Law) - settled in the land promised to them (Israel). They created various festivals to remember their history and the place of God in that process. Christian roots and heritage are in that history.

One of the Jewish festivals that continues to this day, is the Passover. It is a meal to remember, as well as to pass on to the next generation, the night God liberated them from slavery in Egypt. It was at this festival of Passover in Jerusalem on the night of his arrest that Jesus changed the meaning of that meal about the freedom of the Jews from slavery in Egypt to the freedom of all people based on God's Love. Christians continue, in symbolic form, to celebrate this meal in our main celebration of "The Eucharist".

We have our festivals (Christmas, Easter, Pentecost, Harvest, Saints days, Sundays) to remind ourselves of our history, to pass on the story to the next generation, to give thanks and as it says in the Eucharistic prayer request of God to "renew us by your Spirit, inspire us with your love and unite us in the body of your Son, Jesus our Lord".
