**RECTORS THOUGHTS**

As I passed a township in South Africa on a Sunday morning in the comfortable mini bus travelling to another destination, the locals were heading to church in numbers I can only dream of. I started to think about why was it that these people who had so little went to church and yet we who have so much see less and less of the buildings of our heritage.

I started to wonder what made the difference. As a comparison I thought of the Welsh revival in the 19th century. A large group of people who have very little materially, receive little respect and a culture of heavy drinking to forget their problems living in poverty.

The church provided a sense of belonging, a set of rules, a vision out of the poverty, a promise that things will get better.

The preacher's view of the world was simple and dogmatic. A religion based on statements telling people that they were going to hell unless they change their ways. For those who did change their ways, the main aspect being sobriety. This led to wages coming into the household to be spent on food, rent, clothes, etc., rather than drink. This also meant men were not drunk when they came home and not beating up their wives. Women's health was better and less died in child birth. Church provided support and education. Churchgoers made good employees so they are seen by the community as those who get on - Church provided a future, a way out of the poverty.

But what happens when the poor become affluent and educated? They find that the trappings of wealth and education lead them away from the simple statements of the past and desert the church community.

So was wealth and education the true product of revival? No. They were the gift of putting God first.

The church's mistake was not to recognise that babies need milk while adults need solid food. In the Churches case that means that it should have also grown up in its language, argument and the way it presents God and the message.

Fear based religion was never correct especially for the educated. Therefore I've always tried to present the Gospel from a positive perspective.

The general consensus in the western world is that the Church is fine for those in Africa needing to grow out of poverty but we either don't need the church or we follow the Protestant view to its logical conclusion of having an individual relationship with God. Wrong. Whether in Africa or Lincolnshire a relationship with God is a community experience and needs a community response.

## **>>>>> ON TWO WHEELS**

Peter had plenty of time to get to grips with the circuit due to having extra track time. he was deputizing for the injured Aaron Zinatti on the `Red Viper` Honda Superbike. Qualifying went well on his own superstock Yamaha with 2nd row of the grid in 5th place. Riding a three year old Honda in the superbike Peter qualified in 21st.

First race out on the superstock for `Ultimate Racing` proved to be very exciting. First and second places for the championship were already won (Croft) but third place was open. With all to play for Peter rode well and thought out his race and finished in 4th place to take 12 points ahead in 3rd place with 1 point each separating 4th/5th/6th.

With two races in the superbike both went well and Peter finished 14th and 16th giving `Red Viper` team their first points of the season.

### **Magny Cours France 3rd - 5th Oct**

Once again Peter had a wildcard race in the European Superstock races on his Yamaha. With wind and heavy rain and learning new a circuit, first qualifyiny went well - 14th. As the weather dried out having to re-learn a dry track qualifying two proved more difficult, with only two laps 24th place was his best. Race day was dry (the one time we wanted rain!) and Peter finished the race 21st. A bit disappointed Peter came home to his last round of the season at Brands Hatch.

### **Brands Hatch 10th - 12th Oct**

Again Peter rode two bikes, Superstock and Superbike. Qualifying in Superstock went well, front row of the grid in 3rd place. Superbike 22nd. A problem with the No 1 bike made qualifying difficult, and Peter had to race with his No 2. His Superstock race was first of the day and was awesome, after being stopped and restarted Peter rode a magnificent race getting 2nd place - missing the win by 4,000 of a second to championship winner Steve Brogan.

Race 1 Superbike - Superbike got off to a good start but then went backwards finishing in 25th, a fault on the bike made riding very difficult. The team dismantled the front end of No 1 bike and swapped it onto No2 bike.

Race 2 Peter rode the wheels off the bike to finish in 16th place just missing out on points.

**Well done Peter.**
