RECTORS THOUGHTS

Main celebrations in June;

1st Visit of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Elizabeth (mother of John the Baptist, cousin of Jesus),

7th Trinity Sunday (moveable dependent on Easter),

11th Corpus Christi (Thanksgiving for Institution of Holy Communion),

12th St Barnabas the Apostle (normally the 11th),

24th Birth of John the Baptist,

29th SS Peter & Paul Apostles.

The list does not contain the minor celebrations and most months have a similar list.

The advantage if a church is named after any of these saints is that your Patronal Festival will be during the summer and thus hopefully nice weather (not guaranteed in Britain) for a celebration. If you have the patronage of St Thomas of Canterbury (Mumby) 29th December or All Saints (Ulceby/Fordington) 1st November you are not so lucky. St Thomas of Canterbury is a double difficulty as it is straight after Christmas when few will turn out for any service. St Helena (Willoughby) is 18th August (traditionally during the middle of the harvest).

When I was young Patronal festivals were always a big occasion and most important saints days were observed. To celebrate St Michael and All Angels (29th September) in West Watford there was High Mass, which meant Priest, Deacon and sub-Deacon along with 16 servers, and a good party afterwards.

There were 50 to 60 people in the congregation for a week day service. The high days brought colour and drama into the lives of people who saw little positive drama in their normal lives.

Those were the heady days. Today I gather that St Michael's and All Angels still have a strong Sunday congregation with 75 plus. Feast days are smaller affairs, like so many of us these days. The only big feast day in June will be SS Peter & Paul as this is traditionally when most candidates are ordained to the diaconate or to priesthood and then only in the Cathedral or a parish receiving a curate or having their curate priested.

It seems sad to me that we do not celebrate so much these days, in or out of the church. Why is that? Are we less happy or have we less time? Or is one symptomatic of the other? What ever the cause Christianity is about celebration. We glory in the Love of God for us and all creation.

So as Christians lets celebrate, be happy - smile!

WILLOUGHBY & DISTRICT ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Fifty people attended the Annual Parish Meeting/Social Evening on May 14th. Parish Councillor S. Eyre chaired the meeting. Mr N. Howells attended both as a parishioner and representing E.L.D.C.

Colin Hinchcliffe, Russell Mitchell and Michael Clark of Lindsey Marsh Drainage Board gave a general overview and entertaining account of the work of the Drainage Board. Mr Mitchell (Director of Operations) gave details about the engineering problems connected with the Willoughby works.

We all now know that the our new drain leads into the Willoughby High Drain, thence to Chapel Pumping Station - and after that goes to the sea (my geography got lost about here). It was interesting to hear why the drain is so deep, up to 4 metres, on Mr Roughton`s field north of Station Road. This is a hill and the engineering work had to make the flow follow a course which was not natural to it - the water really wants to flow down the middle of Station Road.

The evening also had a Public Forum where people could put forward ideas/problems in the village. **These will be discussed at the Parish Council meeting in June.** The major item was speeding in all areas. (see info below). In the school area problems were double parking, needing an extension of the zig-zag lines and a 20MPH limit outside the school. Extra dog waste bins were needed in two areas. Rubbish in Dawber Lane area need to be cleared, also heavy vehicles were using the lane and damaging the protected verges. Some paths had hedge obstructions and a roadside path to Dawber Lane was mooted. Verges opposite Spring Cottages were being damaged by heavy vehicles.

SPEEDING PROBLEMS

The Parish Council can do something about this, but we need the information from you.

1. If someone is speeding and you can get the number (not that easy if they are doing 80mph) we can ask the Police to establish their identity, call on them and give a verbal warning.
2. If someone is speeding at the same time each day we can ask the Police to set up a radar gun trap around that time (this has been used successfully in Willoughby).

You would need to give this information to a Councillor, names and telephone numbers are on the village notice board at the Green. It would then be discussed at the next Council meeting - and action taken.

If you feel this is informing on people, just think --- would you prefer a child run down by some mindless speeding idiot ---- on your conscience?

Please could you complete and return the slip enclosed with this magazine, to the address stated by 15th June 2009.

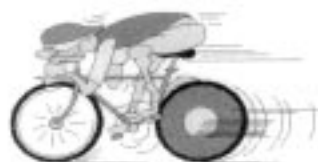
The feedback we get will help us decide whether or not to promote this event, probably towards the end of July this year.
