How should we react to them? When I was a curate 28+ years ago there was a standard line - "Christianity is the only faith, all else is false, a delusion and can be discounted". The implication of this being that we can disregard other people who are different from us as lesser beings.

So while on holiday as guests in their hotels, being served by them or having to deal with them in a call centre we can be rude, disrespectful, etc.! I think not.

I have never accepted the premise. In John's Gospel Jesus taught us about respect for all God's creation. For example; Jesus was by Jacob's well and thirsty. He asked the lady for some water. She was a Samaritan the norm was that Jewish men would not talk to her let alone request a service from her using her vessel. Yet Jesus asked, received, thanked and talked with her.

Christianity is often seen as a negative religion. Can't do this or that, aloof. In fact it is the opposite. Practitioners may often express their faith in worldly terms but the truth of the Gospel is very different. There are core values. Love of all creation. Service to others, the greater the authority the greater the service. Respect for others in what they believe and how they form their society. This does not mean accepting abuse physical or to human dignity.

So this holiday time let us treat everyone we meet with true Christian respect, hospitality and curtesy.

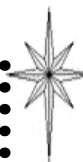

RuralSat Broadband in Sloothby

Many users will be aware that there has been some deterioration in connectivity. I have consulted with RuralSat and put the case that this is partly due to the heavy advertising on TV and Radio encouraging people to watch / download various services such as iplayer, TV catch-up for missed programs etc. Outside the rural districts where landline broadband is available the facilities were once acceptable but now BT report similar problems to ourselves. In Sloothby our situation is worse as we effectively share a single connection amongst approximately twenty households. May I therefore respectfully ask that users refrain from downloading / watching TV programs, films, music and playing games over the internet. (by RuralSat: Playing games and downloading music from a single site is fine also the odd film).

When necessary please try to upgrade your computer software programs etc during the quieter hours. RuralSat inform me that they expect to be making some improvements in the near future. Please pass this information on and thank you for your consideration. Rob
