RECTORS THOUGHTS

In the Rector's Thoughts in March I talked about 8 basic concepts of Christianity; Incarnation, Epiphany, Baptism, Jesus' teaching, Crucifixion, Resurrection, Accession, Pentecost. There were also 5 keys to knowing God; Breathing, Non judgement, Silence, Taking responsibility, Trust. (A copy of the Magazine is on the website if you want to re read it).

Galatians 5:22-23 tells us that when we are living in the Spirit of God there are nine fruits or characteristics that people exhibit; love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, humility, self-control. The passage goes on to say that there is no human law that can bind a person living these.

The notion of "Self-control" has always worried me as it implies we are only acting the part of living in the Spirit of God. If we are in the Spirit our being is changed and we act instinctively. Self-control is a calculating notion.

Those in the Spirit as I have just said, act instinctively which leads them to express the list in Galatians. I would like to add to the Galatians list.

Creative, see themselves and all around them as beautiful, expanding their world, grow in strength and wisdom, can receive and give abundantly as well as be receptive or open to others and possibilities.

St Paul says in 1 Corinthians 13:13 "the greatest of these is Love". Some say "to love wastefully" but this to me implies a limit so I suggest "unconditionally" as there are no limits in God's world.

Human beings are creatures that conceive ideas in their mind and manifest them into the world. If we are living in the Spirit of God then these ideas are constructive, healing and beneficial. If however, we create in on our own, then ideas will be weak in strength or can be harmful. Without the Spirit we can be; destructive, cruel, hateful, see only ugliness, retractive, take and be closed to others and alternatives.

Christianity is not about the "Law", that's Judaism. Christianity is about being connected to a realm far bigger and so more alive than we can conceive. Being a Christian is to search and walk the path that Jesus has shown us.

Knockhill Scotland 3rd-5th July. Round 6.

We are now half way through the season. The weather forecast for the weekend 'heavy showers' and this being Pete's nemesis circuit. He loves the circuit but never goes well; hopefully things will change. Qualifying in the wet he was 15th. **Race 1**- saw a dry race. Peter rode extremely well finishing in 12th place and 2nd in the mirror cup.

Race 2- again was a dry race. Peter rode a strong ride until a bike blew it's engine in front of him, on the side of caution Peter and several riders behind slowed down and put hands up; others ploughed on and the race proceeded, this led the leaders to pull away and Pete lost the tow. He rode a strong race to finish in 14th and 3rd in the mirror cup. His two best results at this circuit so far.

Mallory Park 17th-19th July. Round 7.

First free practice at Mallory was going quite well when disaster happened. Pete had to pull in with a technical fault. The crank in the engine had broken and not having spares or a second engine the bike had to be retired. The spare bike being a sponsors track bike with standard road bike engine then had to come into play.

The front end of Pete's bike was transferred over to the spare bike as special race forks and brakes. He managed 1 lap in the second free practice, as after all the hard work had been done the bike would not start. A fuse that had blown was to blame. Qualifying was a nice surprise in amongst bikes with an excess of 200 horsepower and gadgets a plenty. He was 19th with a shortage of at least 55 hp and a road standard bike (no trick engine parts). The lad did good!

Race 1- Peter was in 18th place when six riders came down with over half distance in the race, it was red flagged and the race declared. Peter moved up to finish in 12th position and 3rd in the mirror cup.

Race 2- With rain falling Peter made good progress and was up to 14th place when heavy rain brought the race to a stop. Finishing in 14th and 2nd in the mirror cup, what started as a disastrous weekend finished with good results. Well done.

Brands Hatch 7th-9th August. Round 8.

Having put a new engine into the bike after Mallory Park, apart from overheating, the bike was going well. Still not fast enough but everything is ok. With new engine, new leathers and new tyres he qualified 16th fastest. With three races, one on Saturday and two on Sunday everything was looking pretty good.

Race 1 - Saturday.

After eight laps Peter made a small mistake at 'Druids Hairpin' and slid off the bike. Peter was ok but, sadly the bike suffered more. The new engine is now broken due to gravel and dust damage and body work second hand; new leathers also worse for wear. All night session saw the race parts once again being swapped over onto the spare bike as it was at Mallory. The following two races were a case of salvaging as many points as possible as the engine was not up to the job. Peter finished 20th overall and 4th in the mirror cup for both races. He hangs onto 2nd place overall in the mirror cup, sadly the gap to 1st has widened.
